

OSLO STANDARD FOR THE ACTIVITY SCHOOL

The Oslo Standard describes what parents and guardians can expect of the Activity School. It also describes what is expected of parents and guardians with children within the scheme. The Standard consists of four areas, selected on the basis of the framework plan for the Activity School and the standard regulations for municipal day-care facilities for schoolchildren in Oslo. The Oslo Standard came into effect at all activity schools on 1 August 2011.

CONTENT AND AMBITIONS

What can you expect of the Activity School?

- There is a clear relationship between content and activities at school and the Activity School
- The Activity School offers varied and organised activities that relate to the target areas in the framework plan
- You will see and experience for yourself what your child has done and learnt at the Activity School
- You will receive schedules for the Activity School

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What can the Activity School expect of you?

 That you keep yourself informed about your child's activities at the Activity School

SAFETY, WELL-BEING AND CARE

What can you expect of the Activity School?

- You will be informed about the Activity School's standard procedures, including those concerning security
- You will receive relevant information well in advance
- You will find that your child enjoys attending the Activity School
- You will find that Activity School staff members are very accommodating
- You will be contacted if any matter concerning your child requires attention

What can the Activity School expect of you?

- That you provide the Activity School with relevant information about your child
- That you treat Activity School staff members with respect
- That you ensure that your child brings along the correct equipment for planned activities at the Activity School



The Education Authority is responsible for the Activity School in Oslo. The purpose of the Activity School is to offer activities that contribute to children's academic and social learning. The Activity School will have a clear framework of rules and will encourage a positive pattern of behaviour.

Each school will prepare schedules that lay out the activities on offer at each individual activity school. The framework plan for the Activity School forms the basis for the school's schedules. ۲

The head teacher is the academic and administrative director of the Activity School and is responsible for ensuring that the school and the Activity School work together for the pupils' academic, social and personal development.

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STRUCTURE AND PREDICTABILITY

What can you expect of the Activity School?

- The Activity School follows the school's regulations and is a structured, predictable place to be
- You will find important and relevant information about the Activity School on the school's website and "Fronter" web pages
- You will receive information about the Activity School's opening hours and planned trips
- You will receive information about main activities at the Activity School
- You will receive information about which activities your child participates in

What can the Activity School expect of you?

- That you collect your child within the opening hours
- That you pay the fees on time
- That you familiarise yourself with the Activity School's regulations and schedules
- That you reply to the Activity School's enquiries concerning signing up for trips, activities and other matters in good time



What can you expect of the Activity School?

- You will be given the opportunity to influence the content at the Activity School through the FAU (Parent–Teacher Association) and the school's governors
- You will be invited to meetings

What can the Activity School expect of you?

- That you provide the Activity School with feedback about things you are satisfied or dissatisfied with
- That you participate in user surveys
- That you participate in meetings and social events

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
